The LIFE PAVEtheWAySTE project ...

The **overall aim** of the project is to facilitate the implementation of the Waste Framework Directive in remote areas, by enabling local and regional authorities to improve their municipal waste recycling performance and thus **pave the way** to high resource efficiency. This will be achieved through the development and application of an economically viable solid waste management plan, based on the demonstration of an **innovative system** for the **fine separation of municipal solid waste (MSW) at source.**
